WHAT DOES DSRM NATIONAL BANK DO WITH YOUR PERSONAL INFORMATION?

Why?

Financial companies choose how they share your personal information. Federal law gives consumers the right to limit some but not all sharing. Federal law also requires us to tell you how we collect, share, and protect your personal information. Please read this notice carefully to understand what we do.

What?

The types of personal information we collect and share depend on the product or service you have with us. This information can include:

- Social Security number and income
- Purchase history and payment history
- Account transactions and credit history

How?

All financial companies need to share customers' personal information to run their everyday business. In the section below, we list the reasons financial companies can share their customers' personal information; the reasons DSRM National Bank chooses to share; and whether you can limit this sharing.

| Affiliates | Companies related by common ownership or control. They can be financial and nonfinancial companies. • Our affiliates include companies with the Valero name. |
| Nonaffiliates | Companies not related by common ownership or control. They can be financial and nonfinancial companies. • Nonaffiliates we share with can include insurance companies and direct marketers. |
| Joint marketing | A formal agreement between nonaffiliated financial companies that together market financial products or services to you. Our joint marketing partners include insurance companies and direct marketers. |

Other important information

Vermont Residents: We will not disclose information about your creditworthiness to our affiliates and will not disclose your personal information, financial information, credit report, or health information to nonaffiliated third parties to market to you, other than as permitted by Vermont law, unless you authorize us to make those disclosures. Additional information concerning our privacy policies can be found at valero.com or by calling 1-800-333-3560. **California Residents:** We treat all accounts with CA mailing addresses as if you elected to limit our sharing for all purposes for which you have that choice, unless you tell us otherwise. We also do not share your personal information for joint marketing with other financial companies.
